### ■ Palm Sunday Music

Please plan to attend our Palm Sunday service on March 24th at 10 a.m. to hear the Senior Choir perform “The Rose of Calvary,” this year’s special Lenten season musical event. Each year the choir, under the direction of Heidi Flower, presents a large-scale musical depiction of the life and passion of Jesus.

Joseph Martin, composer of “The Rose of Cavalry,” notes: “The image of a divine rose from heaven’s own garden blooming in the shadows of our world is a portrait of hope and comfort. When translated into music, it becomes a song that speaks to our deepest needs for restoration and redemption. It sings to us of gardens lost to sin and despair. It reveals to us a lonely garden where ancient olive trees stand silent witness to the suffering of the Savior. It is God’s tender love song reminding us all that we are children of the garden. Finally, at its heart, it is the music of one truly perfect Rose, which choosing grace, died for his beloved thorns.”

# PROSPECT IN EARLIER DAYS

*1943 Holy Week Highlights - Kathy Dube*

During war time, as was the case in 1943, no doubt Holy Week had immense significance for Prospect Church members and friends. Holy Week was observed from April 18th-25th, with new members received on Palm Sunday, the 18th. In addition to the reception of new members, confirmation also took place at the 10:45 a.m. service, the time of worship at that time. The choir, directed by Virginia DuBois, wife of pastor Paul DuBois, presented Joseph Haydn's oratorio "The Passion," or "The Seven Last Words," at a Palm Sunday Vesper Service that afternoon.

Each week day morning during Holy Week, a service of morning prayer was observed in the Prospect Chapel from 7:30 to 7:45 a.m. A Holy Thursday Candlelight Communion Service took place on April 22nd at 7:45 p.m. Prospect also participated in a three-hour community Good Friday service at the Lebanon Swedish Lutheran Church on Stearns Street, now the site of the Salvation Army. Young people from the church helped plan a sunrise service under leadership of the Bristol Council of Religious Education. The entire Church School met in the sanctuary for the Easter Service, described as "one of the high points of the church year."

The April 1943 Tower also noted that the April 11th Lenten Vesper Service featured the duo of Eleanor Burt, violinist, and Virginia DuBois, organist. Finally, several members of the confirmation class received into membership on the 18th visited several points of interest in New York City, along with classes from several other Connecticut churches. The group visited St. Mark's Church, Riverside Church, Union Theological Seminary, The Methodist Hospital and The Church of All Nations.

It aims to make clear that one of the surest ways to test the quality of our walk with God is to examine the way we respond to the needs of others.

The *Fast That I Choose* takes its title from Isaiah 58:6, as the words of the prophet remind us that God wants worship from the heart with the purpose of increasing God's justice in the world.

The first lesson was held on March 10th. The second is scheduled for March 17th from 9 to 10 a.m.

Participants do not need to attend all six units. A sign-up sheet has been placed in Sessions Hall. You may also sign up for units by calling the church office.

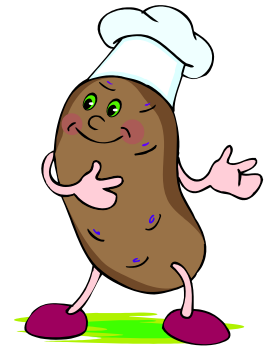
## ■ Bell Choir looking for a few more ringers.
